read an article in an equestrian paper that foals left with the dam for the first 2 years are less likely to develop neurological faults. It also showed that the musculoskeletal development is stronger than in foals that have been removed as soon as weaned. She is now 18 months old & is starting in hand training over the next 6 months.

While Naked Foal Syndrome does not appear to be a large problem in our N. America Teke population, as we only know of one affected foal born approximately 20 years ago, the ATAA BOD has decided to be proactive about this genetic fault.

The ATAA BOD has voted to establish a fund to help owners and breeders test their horses. Working in conjunction with UC Davis, we will offer to pay half of all tests via a coupon code to help owners and breeders to see if their horses are affected and if so, how NOT to pass this defect along.

It has been suggested that all active breeding stallions and brood mares as of 2015 be tested and then if any of these horses show a mutation, test their offspring. We can possibly test other horses, but this has been suggested to start.

We want to be able to publish results in the ATAA Newsletter and on the ATAA website, as a resource. Having your results published will be necessary if you want the coupon. You may, of course, privately test your horses at full price, but we do ask that we be allowed to publish those results also. We feel that the more information we have, the better breeding decisions can be made.

If you would like to add to the Fund, so we can expand this important research, contact a BOD member.

Farm Reports

Swan Farm Akhal-Tekes Dexter, Oregon



With ten horses, including eight pure-bred Akhal-Tekes and a Nez Perce Akhal-Teke sport horse, Swan Farm Akhal-Tekes reached our current planned capacity in 2016. The place is about 20 acres in the Cascade foothills of western Oregon, 20 minutes east of Eugene/Springfield. Swan Farm borders on the Middle Fork Willamette River to the north, and Elijah Bristow State Park to the east, with over 800 acres of attractive trail riding. For serious hill work, the equestrian trails of Mt. Pisgah are a ten-minute trailer ride to the west.

In April 2016, Swan Bir Sah (aka Biri), a tall cremello colt, was born to the leased mare Pipi (by Kambarbay), and in June, following several years of getting well-regarded colts, our lead mare Pallas Athena (aka Tina) seemed delighted to get her first filly (by Kuwwat), the liver chestnut Swan Kyzyl Kometa (aka Kizy). We'll be sad to say good-bye to Pipi soon, once Biri is weaned, as Pipi moves on to her new owner soon. Pipi has become rather attached to Tina, and we hope she finds great new friends in California!

Also at the girl's barn, our buckskin mare Annuschka and her palomino filly Arima finished their social blending, following their arrival from Texas late in 2015. Annuschka was bred to Gidasp via cooled semen. And, pleased with the conformation and spunk of little Kizy, we were happy to repeat the live-cover breeding of Pallas Athena by Kuwwat, so we're looking forward to two new foals again in 2017. At this rate, any year now we'll have babies available to the public!

We're introducing four-year-old Ehyr Atlaz at stud via cooled semen for 2017. Ehyr is a well-built bay stallion, Peren line, by Pan Tau out of Pallas Athena, bred by Amrita Ibold, born and raised at Swan Farm.

Patty has been endurance conditioning steadily with Ulduze, her favorite Akhal-Teke gelding, with



Q: How long have you been interested in Tekes or Teke crosses?

A: Approximately 4 yrs.

Q: How did you hear about the ATAA?

A: Googled Akhal Teke horses in U.S.

Q: Do you own, lease or ride a Teke or Teke cross? If so, what do you do with him/her?

A: We own a Teke stallion, who is part of our Nez Perce Breeding program. He is now in training to be ridden. Then we will explore what his strength is, i.e. dressage, trail, endurance and take him down that path.

Q: What do you like the most about them?

A: Beauty, grace, and loyalty. I had read about the Teke choosing one person as his counterpart. My stallion chose me since I handled him first and he trusted me and bonded with me. As opposed to the relationship with most of my other horses, where I work to gain their trust and liking, my Teke chose ME.

Q: What are your goals for the future with your Teke or Teke cross? See answer 6. Will breed to other mares or ship semen for our business. The breed won me over to where I would be interested in breeding pure Tekes as opposed to only working on the Nez Perce Horse program. I prefer English riding and enjoy going on trails and my background is dressage. But if he shows an aptitude and liking for jumping or endurance, and my partner wants to ride him, then he will head in that direction.

Q: Where do you live?

A: Clarksburg Ontario Canada. Where Georgian Bay meets the Beaver Valley.

Q: How did you hear about Akhal-Teke horses?

A: Long time ago though seeing them in books

Q: What is your experience with horses?

A: Both my husband and I grew up with horses from a very young age. Gile's family successfully bred and competed quarter horses. In my family, I was lucky enough to have a high level trainer and competitor and on the other side of the family a successful Arabian breeder. We both started riding western as children and then both made the switch to English. We have enjoyed many different disciplines with horses from fox hunting to combined driving and competitive trail riding. In recent years, we have focused on Eventing, show jumping, and dressage.

Q: How long have you been interested in Tekes or Teke crosses?

A: Gile has loved the breed for a long time. He introduced me to the breed when we met.

Q: How did you hear about the ATAA?

A: We found the ATAA online but learned more and more from having the privilege of meeting several of its members.

Q: Do you own, lease or ride a Teke or Teke cross? If so, what do you do with him/her?

A: We own a small breeding farm. We have a stallion standing stud (Gerald) whom we compete in Dressage, and are getting ready to offer our second stallion at stud Hendrick. We have several broodmares and some young stock. We start, compete, and sell our young stock with hopes of them going on to become equine athletes.

Q: What do you like the most about them?

A: We love their affection, intelligence, beauty, willingness to learn, and athleticism.

Q: What are your goals for the future with your Teke or Teke cross?

A: We would like to continue to move our Stallion up through the levels in dressage while bringing on his son Hendrick in his discipline of choice. We will continue to breed small numbers of foals and raise them with the goal of them succeeding with wonderful human partners in equine sport.

Q: Where do you live?

A: We winter in Jacksonville, FL and spend our summers in Brevard, NC near the Dupont State Forest where I trail ride. The horses are also "snow birds".

Q: How did you hear about Akhal-Teke horses?

A: In 2012 I rode a very strange-looking old nag at the Sunkar Falcon Center in the Tien Shan mountains near Almaty, Kazakhstan. I could not believe his powerful but very comfortable gaits. The staff spoke no English, so couldn't tell me his breed. I later found out from an artist in the bazaar who sketched horses that my mount was an Akhal-Teke. When we reached Turkmenistan we saw a trainer riding a beautiful AT stallion in the woods near a ruin we were visiting. I was hooked!

Q: What is your experience with horses?

A: I started riding at age 5, galloping bareback across the deserts in Idaho and Arizona, and later showing American Saddlebreds and California reining horses.

: How did you hear about the ATAA?

A: When looking for AT breeders online I found the ATAA website.

: Do you own, lease or ride a Teke or Teke cross? If so, what do you do with him/her?

A: In March, 2013 I found exactly the typy 2 year old filly I was looking for near Calgary. I flew to Canada to visit the breeder, Cynthia Swensen, and returned the proud owner of Gulkana, by Cynthia's stallion Murgab, out of Allegra Steck's mare Guana-Kosteka.

Q: What do you like the most about them?

A: Gulkana is the smartest and most personable horse I

have ever worked with, as well as being the most beautiful with her streamlined elegance. Her free, floating gaits are wonderful to ride in both the show ring and on the trail. She is very alert, but is more likely to freeze in place when startled than to whirl away from something. She wants to investigate and touch strange objects, then check them off her list of scary things. When we turn her out in the pasture after working her, she loves to treat us to a show of highflying acrobatics. However, we never have to lunge her before mounting up, as she is always calm and relaxed when first mounted, even on a cold, windy day.

Q: What are your goals for the future with your Teke or Teke cross?

A: We will continue with dressage training and showing in parallel with trail work. The dressage judges love her movement. My goal for the trail is to be able to ride her out by myself for 3 - 4 hour trail rides in the mountains of western North Carolina.

She is well on the way to proving herself a competent performance horse, a prerequisite for my using her as a brood mare. I do not want to become an AT breeder, but would consider breeding her under contract to an acceptable stallion. Her genes are too good to be wasted!




